Responsibilities of School Staff

- Encourage your child to show friendship and respect for others and to abide by the school behaviour policy, ensuring a safe, caring environment for all
- Keep you informed about your child's progress and behaviour, through parents' evenings, an end of year report and further communication as necessary.
 NB: In the case of non-resident parents (ie a parent with parental responsibility but with whom the child does not live for the majority of the time), we will share statutory information with both parents, and other information will be shared according to the guidelines set out in the document "Understanding and dealing with issues relating to parental responsibility" Department for Education, 2018.
- Set regular and appropriate homework for your child as outlined in the school's homework policy.

- Keep you informed about school activities, what your child is currently studying in the curriculum, school events and policies through letters, the school website (<u>www.st-peres-brafferton.n-yorks.sch.uk</u>), home-school diaries, text and e-mail.
- Endeavour to make you feel welcome whenever you are invited to visit the school and respond to your questions or concerns as quickly as possible.
- Allow children safe and secure use of the internet through a combination of site filtering and supervision and by teaching children how to stay safe and act responsibly
- Maintain high levels of confidentiality both in and out of school

- Read all information sent home and ensure any response required is returned promptly
- Help our/my child to develop positive attitudes to others regardless of gender, race, colour, class, ability, culture, belief, faith, values, sexual orientation, age and need
- Help our/my child to become an active member within the local community
