### Music Long Term Plan

#### **SEND** statement

Music is a universally accessible subject. Practical activities, including singing, playing and listening occupy at least 80% of curriculum time. These activities are designed so that every child can participate in, and progress from, their current individual level. This applies equally to SEND children and gifted musicians. Classroom-based learning takes account of the needs of SEND pupils, for example by facilitating alternative ways of recording work.

Reception pupils work take part in music as part of their Early Years curriculum – Communication and Language, Physical Development and Expressive Arts and Design (see Music in the Early Years).
