At St Peter's Brafferton Church of England Voluntary Aided Primary School our teaching of RE is underpinned by our Christian vision and values: **Kindness, Inclusivity and Community**. Our vision is for every pupil to flourish as an independent learner, be a respectful citizen and be confident in the knowledge and understanding of a range of faiths and world views.

Our local and wider community are involved in enhancing our RE curriculum through regular visits to the local church, visits to other places of worship and special visitors in school.

RE is taught through 'Understanding Christianity' and the 'Dioceses of Leeds and York Syllabus'. Class weekly sessions are structured through in-depth discussions, questioning, making connections and debating, to gain a personal view of the world.

Staff are trained to deliver high quality RE lessons as a core subject in our school. Governors support leaders to deliver a highly aspiration RE curriculum and leaders are also supported by the Diocese with regular Advisor visits.
